Emory celebrates open data with Love Your Data Week



Emory Libraries' Research Data Management Services is taking part in the national Love Your Data Week Feb. 8-12. Emory is one of 22 universities participating in the event, which centers primarily around daily social media conversations (#LYD16) on Facebook and Twitter that will provide answers and helpful information about organizing data, sharing research, storing and retrieving data, and setting up a unique author ID with ORCID.

Emory's open data team will also have three in-person workshops for researchers, to be held in the Woodruff Library, which will appeal to graduate students and early-career researchers in particular.

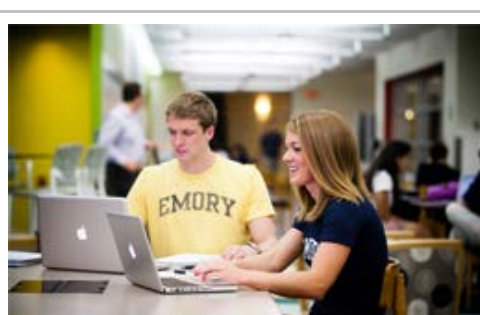
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
