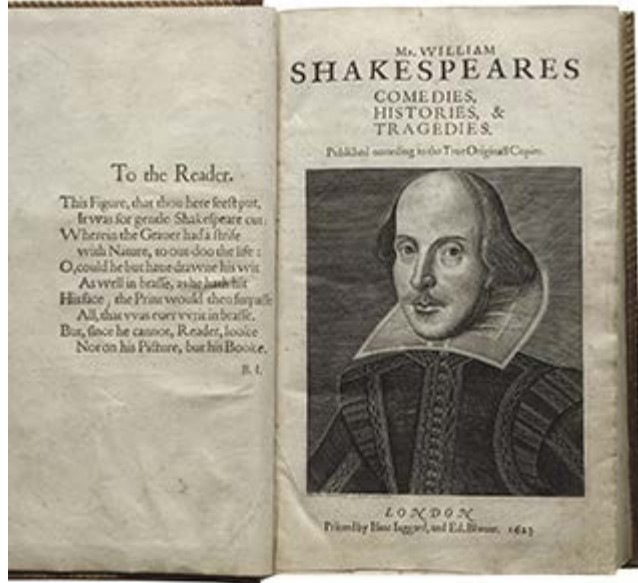

Emory celebrates First Folio arrival with events throughout November

Emory's Year of Shakespeare culminates Saturday, Nov. 5, when the First Folio arrives from the Folger Shakespeare Museum for a limited month-long exhibition at the Michael C. Carlos Museum.

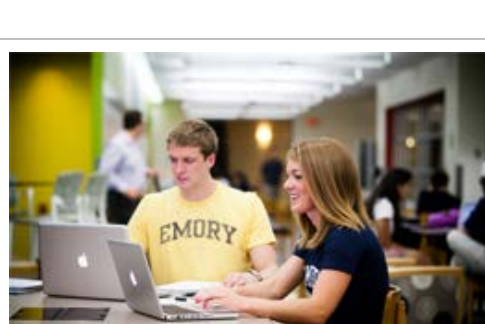
